
How do I get to the Library's Online Resources?

1. Go to our home page: www.splibraries.org and Click on "Premium Databases."




2. Click on the database you wish to access.




3. Enter your 14 digit library card number and password. (If you do not have a password, please call any of our libraries and a staff member will enter one in your account.) Click "Log In."

RESEARCH

- <u>Biography in Context</u> Listen to or read nearly a million biographies spanning history and geography.
- General OneFile For students of all ages, offers access to about 25 million database records with nearly 8,000 titles from 1980 to present. Also included are 89 newspapers from around the world such as The New York Times, Wall Street Journal, and Christian Science Monitor. Plus general interest magazines and refereed academic journals.
- <u>Junior Edition</u> Designed specifically for middle school students; contains more than 130 magazines and journals. Find authoritative sources for research and answers to general reference questions.
- Junior Reference Collection Middle school students have quick access to information on science, literature, arts, biographies and general reference; contains primary documents, video and audio clips, 1000's of flags, maps, and photographs; topic overviews, plot summaries and literary criticism, and Research Tools and a Research Guide. Articles are rated by reading level.
- <u>Student Edition</u> Designed for high school students; this resource provides a quick and easy way to research, complete assignments, and find answers to general reference questions in a simple colorful format. It contains more than 1000 full-text sources, including the magazines, newspapers and ready reference sources that students, teachers, and librarians value.
- <u>World News Digest</u> Contains U.S. and World news since 1940. Research current events, events by decade, country or issue; offers in-depth profiles on an issue; suggests possible research topics.

LITERATURE & BOOKS

- <u>LitFinder</u> Covers all time periods and contains more than 126,500 poems, 5,000 short stories, 2,800 essays; 1,800 speeches; and 1,000 plays.
- <u>Literature Resource Center</u> Locate information about authors, their writings or literary criticism about their works.
- <u>Overdrive Audio & E-Books</u> Listen to audio books and view e-books, fiction and non-fiction; books can be down-loaded to your computer and transferred to many devices.

OTHER

- <u>Weblinks</u> (by subject) & <u>Teen Weblinks</u> Our librarians have selected websites for math, science and other subjects.
- Informe (Spanish) Provides full text of more than 420
 Hispanic and bilingual magazines. Other features include a thesaurus and title annotations in both English and Spanish.
- <u>Learning Express Library</u> Online practice tests for ACT, SAT, FCAT, AP, CLEP and TOEFL. Improve writing, reading and math skills.
- <u>Special E-Collections</u> Electronic collections from specialized encyclopedias in print are available for subjects such as Health, the Civil War, Psychology, Pop Culture and General Science. Found in different categories.
